

How to package your currency

Coins, in particular, are natural escape artists and will always find a way out of packaging, so they must be packed correctly.

It's simple and easy, so let's show you how.

Sending Banknotes in the FREEPOST Envelope

If you send just banknotes, place them in folded cardboard (such as a greeting card) and use a non-see-through envelope. For multiple notes, consider using a cardboard or padded envelope.

Please do NOT send coins in the FREEPOST envelope.

Sending Coins and Notes in a Box

Pack the currency into a carrier bag or similar if you send coins and notes in a box or parcel.

We suggest you put no more than ten kilos in any bag.

Secure the bag with strong tape all around it. Then, secure it in another carrier bag with strong tape.

Place the double-bagged coins into a robust and tight-fitting cardboard box.

To prevent the coins from moving around, fill any spare space in the box with scrap paper and secure it with tape.
